JAIANTIA HILLS

The Jaintia Hills is a mountainous, nature-rich region in the eastern part of Meghalaya state northeastern India. Known for its immense biodiversity deep caves and dense forests. It serves as the home to the indigenous Pnar (Jaintia) people a matrilineal tribe. Administratively, the area is split into two districts: West Jaintia Hills (headquartered at Jowai) and East Jaintia Hills (headquartered at Khliehriat).

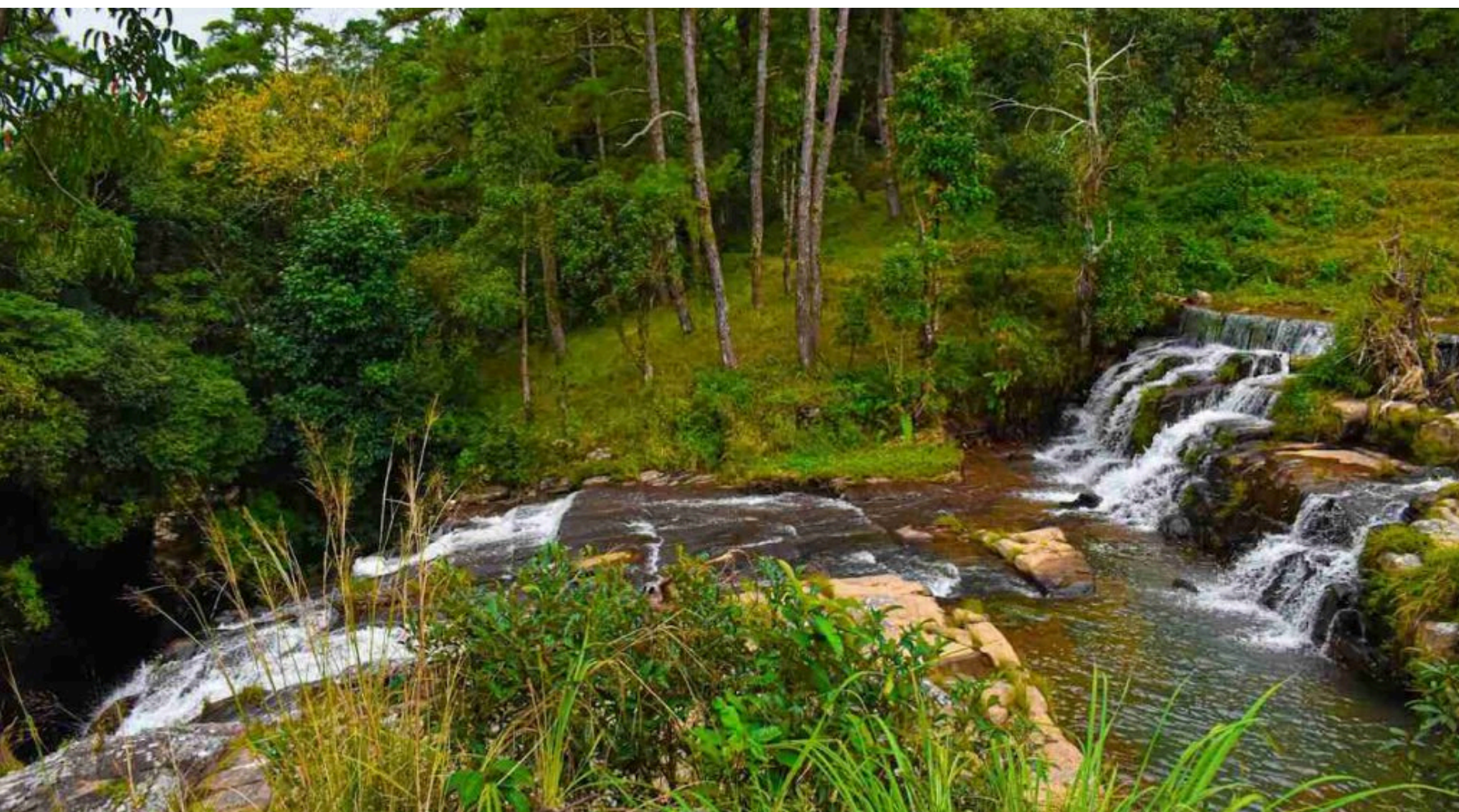

KRANG SURI FALLS (WEST JAINTIA HILLS)

Krang Suri Falls, located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya is widely regarded as one of the most stunning and serene waterfalls in India. Famous for its crystal clear turquoise blue water and picturesque surroundings, it is often considered a hidden gem providing a peaceful contrast to some of the larger more dramatic falls in the state.



TYRSHI FALLS

Tyrshi Falls is a stunning lesser known waterfall located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. Often described as a hidden gem, it is known for its serene environment surrounding lush greenery and agricultural landscapes making it a popular spot for nature lovers and photographers.



CHYMPE/KHADDUM SHYMPE FALLS

Chympe Falls (also known as Khaddum Falls or Shympe Falls) and the nearby Krem Chympe are spectacular largely unexplored, natural wonders located in the East Jaintia Hills of Meghalaya, India. This area is renowned for its dense forests, emerald-green, tiered, cascading waters and one of the longest river cave systems in the country.



NOHKAWANG FALLS

Nohkawang Falls (also known as Thwe Daloi) is a stunning relatively offbeat waterfall located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. It is known for its tall elegant plunge into a deep lush valley surrounded by pristine nature.



PAITHLU FALLS

Moo Paithlu Falls (also spelled Moopaithlu or Paithlu) is a stunning lesser known and largely unexplored waterfall located in the East Jaintia Hills of Meghalaya, India. It is known as an "offbeat" destination, ideal for nature lovers seeking to escape crowded tourist spots.



MOOPUN FALLS

Moopun Falls (or Moopun Waterfalls) is a scenic relatively offbeat tourist destination located in the East Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. Situated on the Umjhai River near Mutong village, it is known for its tranquil atmosphere, a unique stone bridge and a natural sandy-banked, crystal clear swimming pool.





NARTIANG MONOLITHS

The Nartiang Monoliths, located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India, constitute the largest known collection of megalithic stones in a single area. Situated in the village of Nartiang, which once served as the summer capital of the Jaintia Kings, this site is a significant cultural landmark featuring hundreds of standing stones (menhirs).



NARTIANG DURGA TEMPLE

The Nartiang Durga Temple, located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya is a 600-year-old shrine and one of the 51 Shakti Peethas (holy sites) in India. It is highly revered by devotees of the Shaktism sect, who believe it is the permanent abode of Goddess Durga and the spot where Goddess Sati's left thigh fell.



JOWAI



Jowai is a scenic hill town and the headquarters of the West Jaintia Hills district in the state of Meghalaya, India. Situated on a plateau at an altitude of 1,380 meters above sea level, it is surrounded on three sides by the Myntdu River. The town is home to the Pnar tribe (a sub-tribe of the Khasi people) and is known for its cultural heritage and natural landscapes including cascading waterfalls and green surroundings.



KREM CHYMPE

Krem Chympe is a magnificent largely unexplored river cave located in the East Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. It is officially recognized as the fifth-longest cave in India, with over 10.5 km to 19 km of its length surveyed and mapped. Known for its stunning pristine environment, it is considered one of the most spectacular river caves in the world.



THADLASKEIN LAKE

Thadlaskein Lake, locally known as Pung Sajar Nangli is a prominent, historical and serene man made lake located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. Situated on the National Highway 6 near Mukhla village, roughly 8-9 km from Jowai and 58 km from Shillong. It is a popular destination for tourists seeking tranquility and historical insights.





IAIONG PARK & SACRED GROVE

Ialong Park and its adjacent Sacred Grove, located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya offer a blend of natural beauty, rich biodiversity and deep cultural heritage, making them a significant eco-tourism hub near Jowai. The area is particularly famous for its panoramic views of the Pynthorwah Valley and its preserved ancient forest.
