# PARIS

Paris, the capital of France is a global hub for art fashion, gastronomy and culture located on the Seine River. Known as the "City of Light", it features iconic landmarks like the Eiffel Tower, Louvre Museum and Notre Dame Cathedral. With a metropolitan population over 10 million, it is a dense historic city known for its café culture, haute couture and romantic atmosphere.

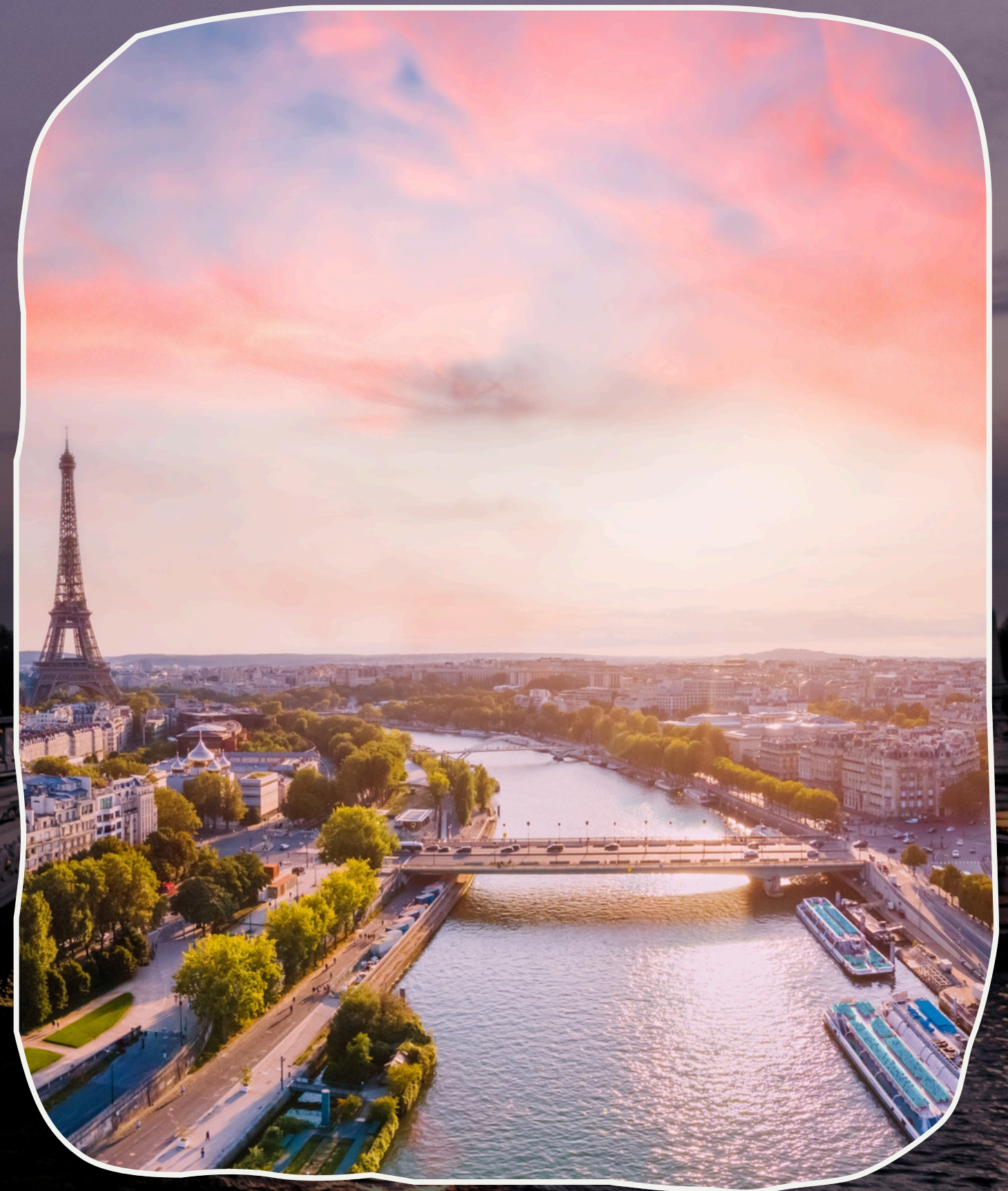

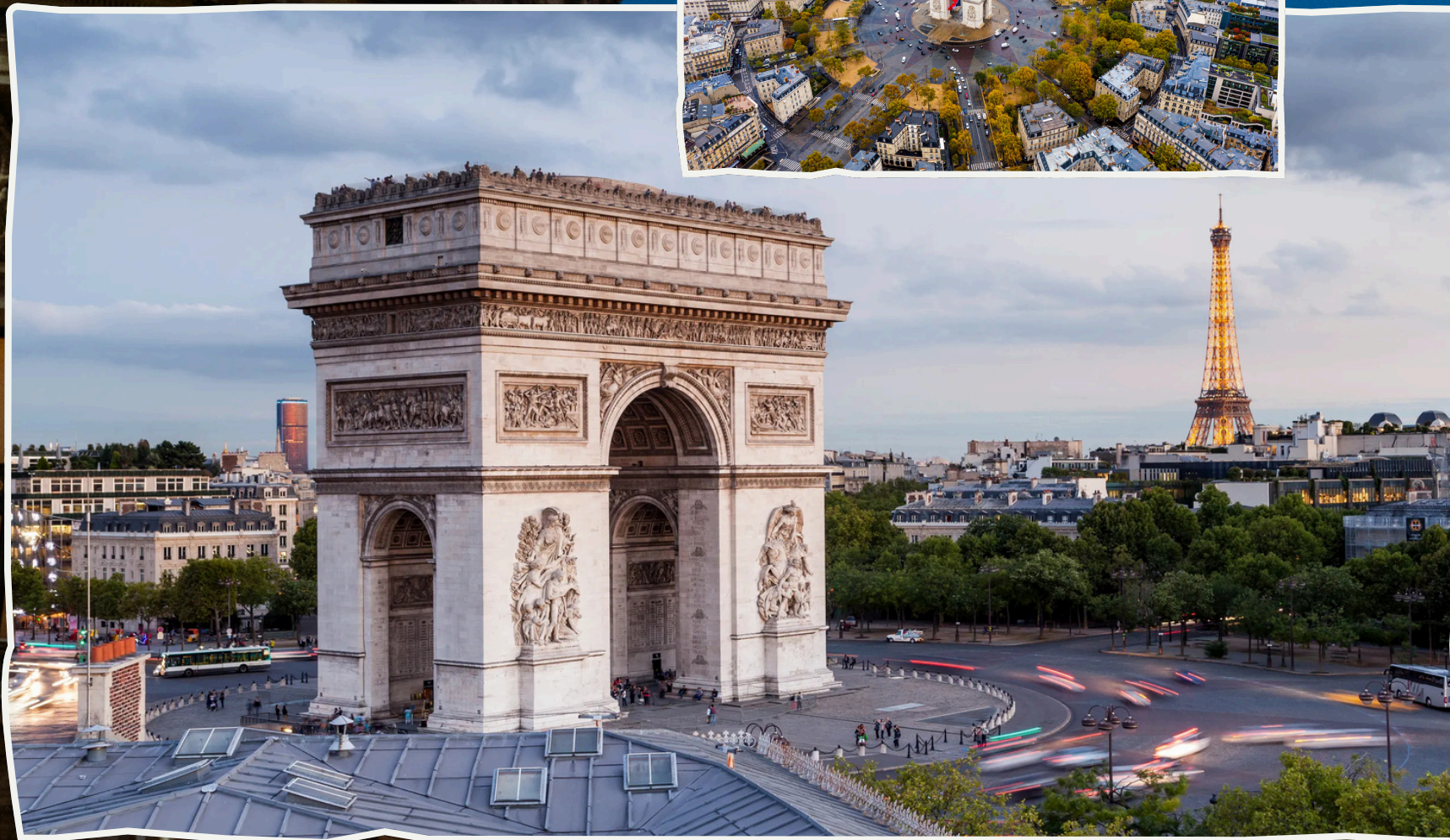

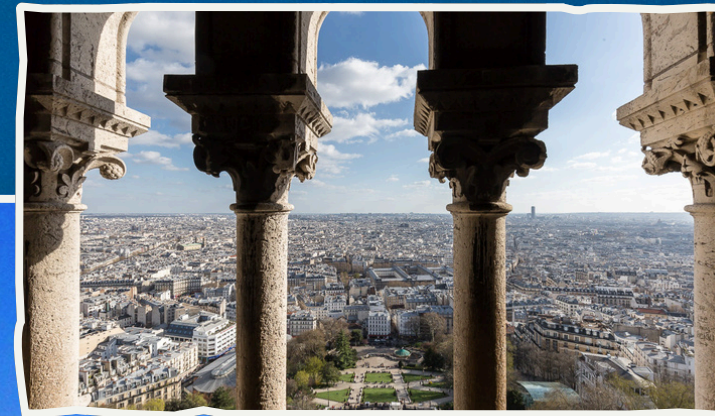
## ***EIFFEL TOWER***

The Eiffel Tower is a 330-meter (1,083 ft) iron lattice tower in Paris, France, built by Gustave Eiffel for the 1889 World's Fair. It is a global cultural icon, featuring three levels with restaurants, shops and observation decks that attract nearly 7 million visitors annually. It sparkles on the hour every night.



## ***ARC DE TRIOMPHE***

The Arc de Triomphe is a massive neoclassical triumphal arch and one of the most iconic symbols of French national identity. Standing at the western end of the Champs-Élysées, it serves as a memorial to those who fought and died for France during the French Revolutionary and Napoleonic Wars.



## ***SACRE - COEUR BASILICA (MONTMARTRE)***

The Basilique du Sacré-Cœur de Montmartre (Basilica of the Sacred Heart) is a major Roman Catholic church and minor basilica located at the highest point in Paris on the summit of the butte of Montmartre. Consecrated in 1919, it is the second most visited landmark in the city after the Eiffel Tower.



## ***SEINE RIVER CRUISE***

Seine River cruises in Paris offer iconic sightseeing tours, showcasing landmarks like the Eiffel Tower, Notre-Dame and the Louvre, usually lasting 1-3 hours. Options include budget-friendly 1-hour daytime sightseeing, romantic dinner cruises with live music and evening cruises to witness the "City of Light". Key companies include Bateaux Mouches, Vedettes de Paris and Bateaux Parisiens.



## ***LOUVRE MUSEUM***

The Louvre in Paris is the world's largest and most visited art museum, hosting over 9 million visitors annually in a former royal palace. Located on the Seine's Right Bank, it houses thousands of works including the Mona Lisa and Venus de Milo. The museum covers art from antiquity to the 19th century across three main wings: Denon, Sully and Richelieu.



## **MUSEE D'ORSAY**

The Musée d'Orsay is a renowned art museum in Paris, France, situated on the Left Bank of the Seine. Housed in a converted Beaux Arts railway station (formerly the Gare d'Orsay built in 1900), it officially opened in 1986. It holds the world's largest collection of Impressionist and Post Impressionist masterpieces dating from 1848 to 1914.

## **SAINTE - CHAPELLE**

Sainte-Chapelle located on the Île de la Cité in Paris is a 13th-century Gothic masterpiece commissioned by King Louis IX to house holy relics, including Christ's Crown of Thorns. Known for its stunning Rayonnant-style architecture, the chapel features over 600 square meters of 13th-century stained-glass windows, creating a mesmerizing, luminous interior.



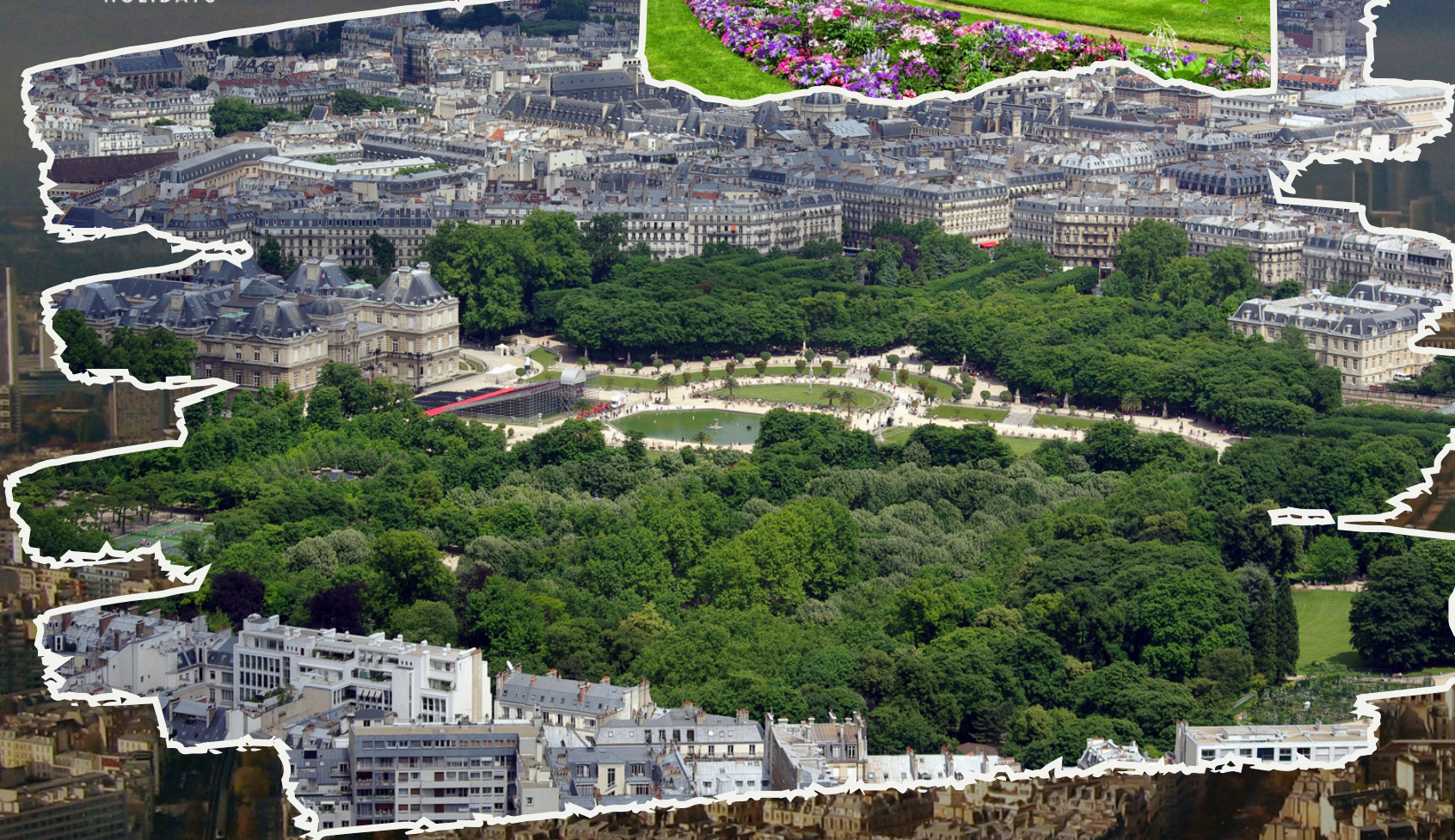
## ***MONTMARTRE***

Montmartre is a historic bohemian hilltop neighborhood in Paris's 18th arrondissement known for its steep cobblestone streets, artistic heritage and the white domed Sacré Cœur Basilica. Formerly an independent village, it became a famous artistic hub in the late 19th century featuring iconic spots like the Place du Tertre, Moulin Rouge and the city's only working vineyard.



## ***LE MARAIS***

Le Marais spanning parts of the 3rd and 4th arrondissements, is a historic trendy Paris district known for medieval architecture, cobblestone streets and vibrant LGBTQ+ and Jewish culture. It features landmarks like Place des Vosges, the Picasso Museum and unique shopping, offering a lively mix of history and modern boutique culture.



## ***JARDIN DU LUXEMBOURG***

## ***SAINT - GERMAIN - DES - PRES***

The Jardin du Luxembourg, located in Paris's 6th arrondissement is a 25 hectare (approx. 57-acre) public park commissioned by Queen Marie de' Medici in 1612. It serves as the home to the French Senate (in the Luxembourg Palace) and features formal French/English gardens, 100+ statues, the iconic Médicis Fountain and a large octagonal model boat pond [Jardin du Luxembourg - Senate, Visit Paris Region.

Saint-Germain-des-Prés, located in Paris's 6th arrondissement on the Left Bank is a historic upscale neighborhood renowned as a former hub for intellectuals, artists and writers. It features iconic cafés like Les Deux Magots and Café de Flore, the 12th century Église Saint-Germain-des-Prés, art galleries and the Jardin du Luxembourg.
