It is a federal republic of 26 cantons with a population of approximately 9 million people (2026 est.) and four official languages. Key cities include Zürich, Geneva and the capital, Bern.

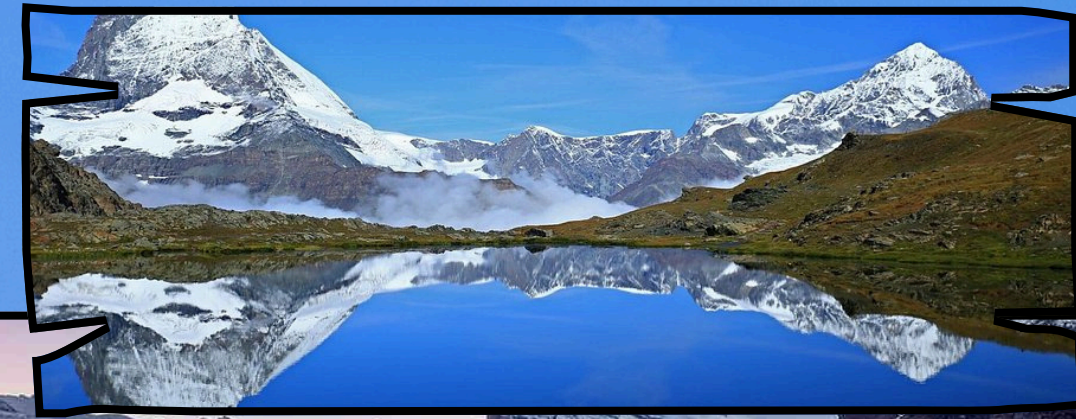

LUCERNE (LUZERN)

Lucerne (Luzern) is a picturesque city in central Switzerland known as the gateway to the Alps located on the shores of Lake Lucerne and the Reuss River. As the capital of the canton of Lucerne, it is famous for its 14th century Chapel Bridge well preserved medieval Old Town and proximity to mountains like Pilatus and Rigi.

ZERMATT & THE MATTERHORN

Zermatt is a premier car free Swiss alpine resort at 1,620m, famous for year-round skiing, luxury and its location at the foot of the iconic 4,478m pyramidal Matterhorn. Located in Valais on the Italian border, it offers world class hiking. the Gornergrat rack railway and the highest cable car (Matterhorn Glacier Paradise) in Europe.



INTERLAKEN

Interlaken is a premier Swiss resort town nestled in the Bernese Oberland between Lake Thun and Lake Brienz. As the adventure capital of Europe, it offers year round thrills like paragliding, skydiving and skiing, alongside boat rides and easy access to the Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau mountains.



GRINDELWALD

Grindelwald is a premier year round alpine village in Switzerland's Bernese Oberland (Canton Bern) renowned for its stunning location at the foot of the iconic Eiger and Wetterhorn mountains. As a hub for the Jungfrau region, it offers access to popular attractions like the Jungfrau Top of Europe railway, Grindelwald First (cliff walk) and extensive skiing or hiking.



WENGEN

Wengen is a picturesque car free mountain village in the Bernese Oberland region of Switzerland, perched on a sunny, sheltered terrace 1,274 meters above the Lauterbrunnen Valley. Known for its stunning views of the Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau mountains, it serves as a top destination for hiking, skiing and relaxation.



ZURICH

Zurich is Switzerland's largest city, a global financial hub and a top-ranked city for quality of life, located in north central Switzerland at the tip of Lake Zurich. Known as a "small metropolis," it blends historic charm in the Old Town with modern innovation, vibrant nightlife and proximity to the Alps.



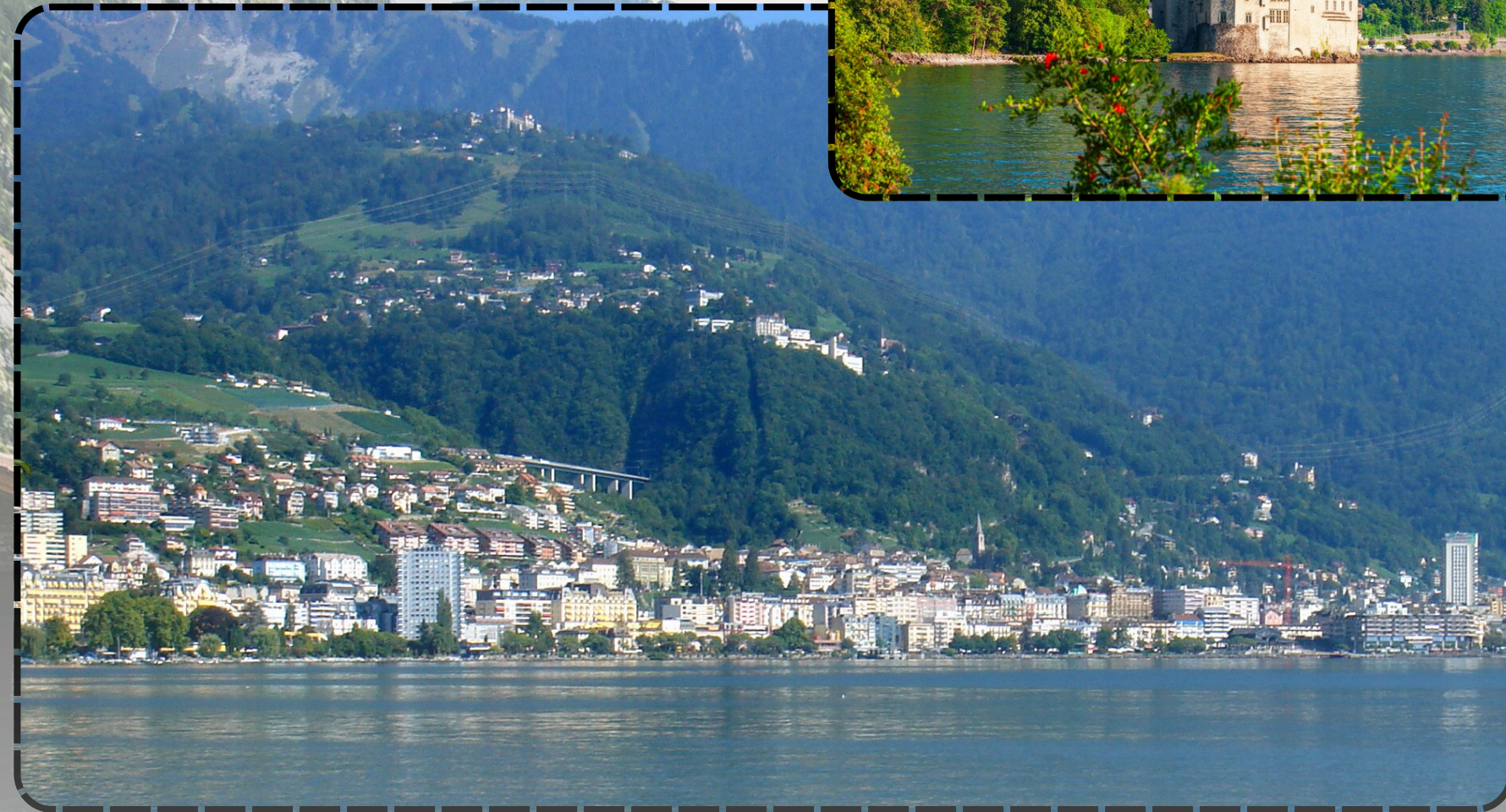
BERN

Bern is the de facto capital (or "federal city") of Switzerland, located in the canton of Bern along the Aare River. Founded in 1191, it is famous for its preserved medieval Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site and serves as the country's political, cultural and administrative hub with a population of approximately 146,000.



LAUTERBRUNNEN

Lauterbrunnen is a stunning U-shaped valley village in the Swiss Alps, renowned for its dramatic limestone cliffs, verdant meadows and 72 waterfalls. Located in the Canton of Bern near Interlaken, it is a premier destination for hiking, nature and alpine scenery frequently cited as a fairy tale setting.



MONTREUX & LAKE GENEVA

ST. MORITZ

Montreux is a premier resort town on the shores of Lake Geneva in French-speaking Switzerland, renowned for its mild microclimate, palm tree lined promenades and the world famous Montreux Jazz Festival. Nestled between steep hills and the lake, it offers stunning views of the Alps, the historic Chillon Castle and a vibrant cultural scene in the heart of the "Swiss Riviera".

St. Moritz is a world renowned luxury Alpine resort town in Switzerland's Engadine Valley (canton of Graubünden), situated at 1,856 meters above sea level. Known as the birthplace of winter tourism, it is a premier destination for skiing, polo on ice and high end shopping having twice hosted the Winter Olympics.



RHINE FALLS (NEUHAUSEN)

The Rhine Falls located in Neuhausen near Schaffhausen in northern Switzerland is the largest waterfall in Europe measuring 150 meters (492 ft) wide and 23 meters (75 ft) high. Formed 14,000–17,000 years ago, this powerful, accessible year-round attraction is popular for boat trips, viewing platforms and close up views of the spray.

LAKE LUCERNE

Lake Lucerne (Vierwaldstättersee) is a stunning fjord like lake in Central Switzerland known for its 114 km area, dramatic mountain scenery (Rigi and Pilatus) and historic importance. It's popular for scenic boat trips, swimming and exploring surrounding historic sites like the Rütli Meadow. It offers a stunning blend of nature and culture.



ALETSCHE GLACIER

The Aletsch Glacier is the largest and longest glacier in the Alps, stretching approximately 22–23 km in the Swiss canton of Valais. Covering about 80 km. it is a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its massive 900 meter deep ice flow at Konkordiaplatz. Key viewpoints include Jungfrauoch, Eggishorn and Bettmerhorn.



BERNINA EXPRESS

The Bernina Express is a premier panoramic train connecting Chur/St. Moritz (Switzerland) to Tirano (Italy) offering a UNESCO World Heritage journey through the Swiss Engadin Alps. It operates year-round, featuring panoramic cars that cross 196 bridges and pass through 55 tunnels, ascending to 2,253 meters at the Bernina Pass.

GLACIER EXPRESS

The Glacier Express is a renowned panoramic train in Switzerland, often called the "slowest express train in the world". It travels in 8 hours between the mountain resorts of Zermatt and St. Moritz traversing 291 bridges and 91 tunnels through the Swiss Alps. The scenic route operates daily year round, featuring panoramic windows and on board dining.

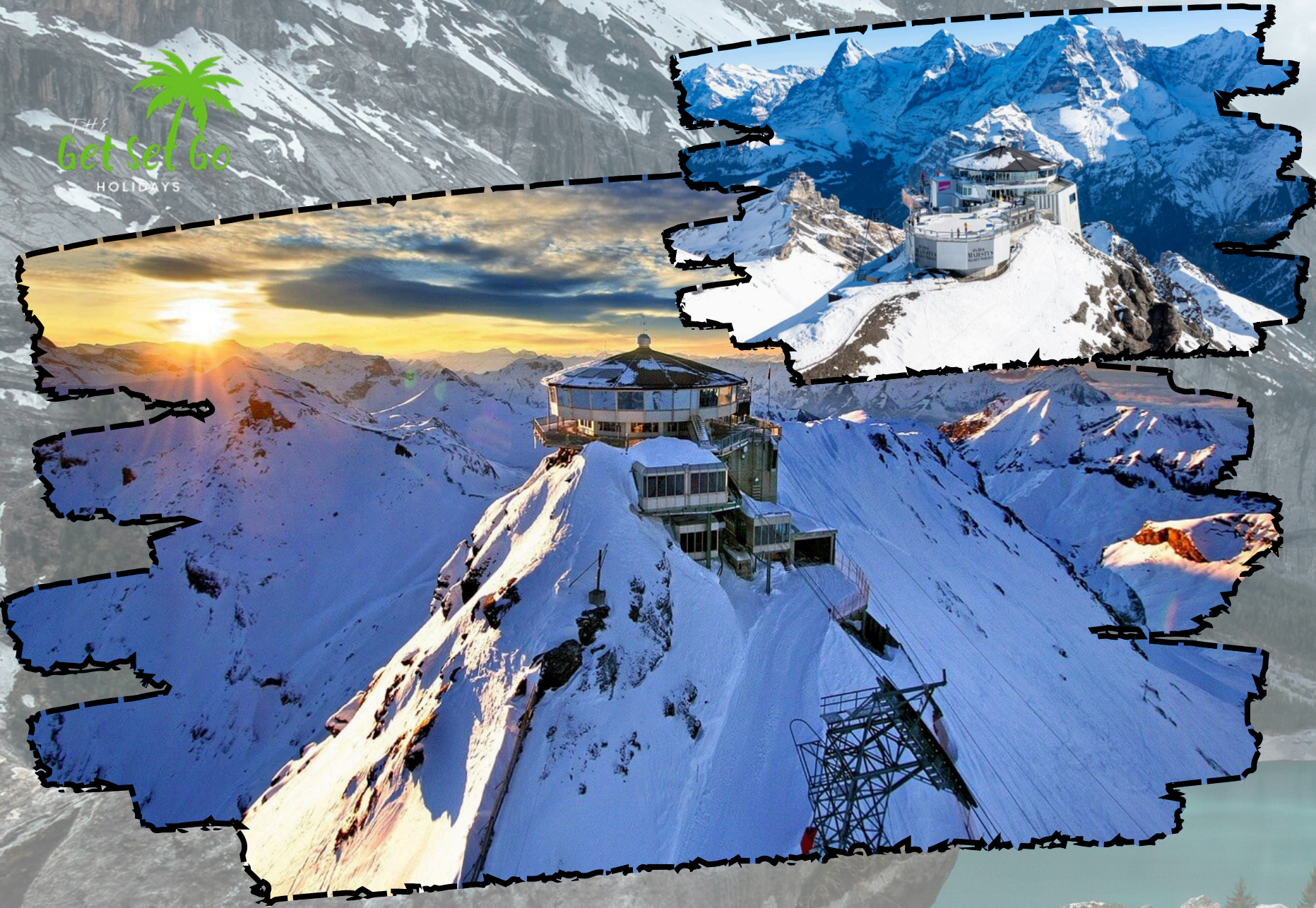


MOUNT PILATUS

LUGANO

Mount Pilatus is a dramatic mountain massif overlooking Lucerne in Central Switzerland, famous for its 2,128-meter-high summit (Tomlishorn), the world's steepest cogwheel railway, and rich dragon legends. Known as "Dragon Mountain," it offers year-round panoramic views of 73 Alpine peaks, hiking trails, and the popular "Golden Roundtrip" tour involving boat, cogwheel, and cable car.

SCHILTHORN

The Schilthorn is a 2,970-meter (9,744 ft) peak in the Swiss Bernese Alps offering 360-degree panoramic views of the Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau mountains. Famous for the revolving restaurant Piz Gloria and its role in the 1969 James Bond film On Her Majesty's Secret Service, it is accessible by a steep cable car from Stechelberg.



ZOO BASEL

Zoo Basel (officially Zoologischer Garten Basel or affectionately "Zolli") is Switzerland's oldest and largest zoo opened on July 3, 1874. Located in Basel, it features over 500 species and 11,000+ animals (as of 2024) ranking among Europe's most important zoos due to successful breeding programs for endangered species like Indian rhinos and gorillas.
