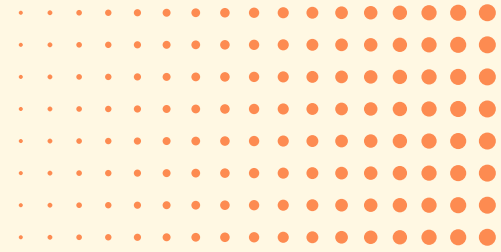

BANGKOK

Bangkok the capital of Thailand often called the "Big Mango" or Krung Thep is a vibrant densely populated metropolis known for its intense energy, street food culture and mix of modern skyscrapers with historic gilded temples. Located on the Chao Phraya River. It serves as Thailand's central hub for culture, commerce and tourism attracting millions with sites like the Grand Palace, Wat Arun and massive shopping centers.

THE GRAND PALACE & WAT PHRA KAEW

The Grand Palace and Wat Phra Kaew in Bangkok form the city's most sacred and historic landmark established in 1782 by King Rama I. Located on Rattanakosin Island, the complex is the ceremonial heart of Thailand, featuring stunning Thai architecture and housing the revered Emerald Buddha.



WAT ARUN (TEMPLE OF DAWN)

Wat Arun, the Temple of Dawn is an iconic Buddhist temple on the Chao Phraya River in Bangkok renowned for its 70–86 meter central Khmer style prang (tower) encrusted with colorful porcelain. It symbolizes Mount Meru, the center of the universe in Buddhist cosmology and is famous for its stunning sunset views.





WAT PHO

Wat Pho or Wat Phra Chetuphon is Bangkok's oldest and largest temple complex (dating before 1782) famous for the massive 46-meter long Reclining Buddha statue. Located near the Grand Palace, it is renowned as the birthplace of traditional Thai massage a center for education and a premier site for viewing gilded Buddhist art.



WAT TRAIMIT

Wat Traimit in Bangkok located near Chinatown houses the world's largest solid gold Buddha statue known as Phra Phuttha Maha Suwanna Patimakon. The 700+ year old Sukhothai style statue is 3 meters tall, weighs 5.5 tons and was discovered under plaster in the 1950s. The temple also features the Yaowarat Chinatown Heritage Center.

KING POWER MAHANAKHON

King Power Mahanakhon is a 314-meter tall 78 story mixed use skyscraper in Bangkok's Silom/Sathorn district known for its unique "pixelated" design. Opened in 2016 it was Thailand's tallest building and features luxury residences, a hotel and the famous top floor MahaNakhon SkyWalk, which includes a thrilling glass tray floor.





ICONSIAM

ICONSIAM is a colossal mixed use development and luxury shopping destination located on the banks of the Chao Phraya River in Bangkok. Known as the "Mother of All Malls," it spans over 750,000 square meters and features more than 7,000 shops and 100 restaurants. It is famous for blending high end international luxury with traditional Thai culture making it a major landmark for both shopping and entertainment.



CHOCOLATE VILLE

Chocolate Ville in Bangkok is a massive open air European themed restaurant and dining park designed like a fairytale village. Located in Khan Na Yao, it features a lighthouse, canals and colorful, photogenic, themed buildings. It serves international and Thai cuisine acting more as an Instagrammable theme park than a traditional eatery.



KHAO SAN ROAD

Khao San Road is a legendary bustling 410 meter street in Bangkok famously known as a "backpacker's mecca" and a hub for budget travel, nightlife and street food. Located in the historic Phra Nakhon district. It transforms at night into a vibrant party scene with bars, music and street stalls offering a chaotic yet essential experience for tourists.



JIM THOMPSON HOUSE

The Jim Thompson House is a museum in central Bangkok that was once the private residence of James H.W. Thompson, an American architect and entrepreneur credited with revitalizing the Thai silk industry. Built in 1959, the complex is a masterpiece of traditional Thai architecture, consisting of six antique teakwood houses relocated from across Thailand and reassembled without nails.



SAFARI WORLD

Safari World in Bangkok is a premier 480 acre open air zoo and leisure park (opened 1988) located on the city's outskirts, featuring a drive through Safari Park and a walk through Marine Park. It offers, animal shows (dolphins, sea lions, orangutan boxing) and feeding experiences particularly at the popular giraffe terrace.



CHAO PHRAYA RIVER CRUISE

Chao Phraya River dinner cruises in Bangkok offer a popular 2-hour evening experience featuring luxurious multi deck vessels with Thai and international buffets, live music and scenic views of landmarks like Wat Arun and the Grand Palace. Cruises typically cost ฿880-฿990, departing from major piers like River City or ICONSIAM often featuring special Saturday drone shows.

Easily accessible from Bangkok via bus or taxi, it offers a cheaper, faster paced alternative for seaside entertainment and adventure activities.

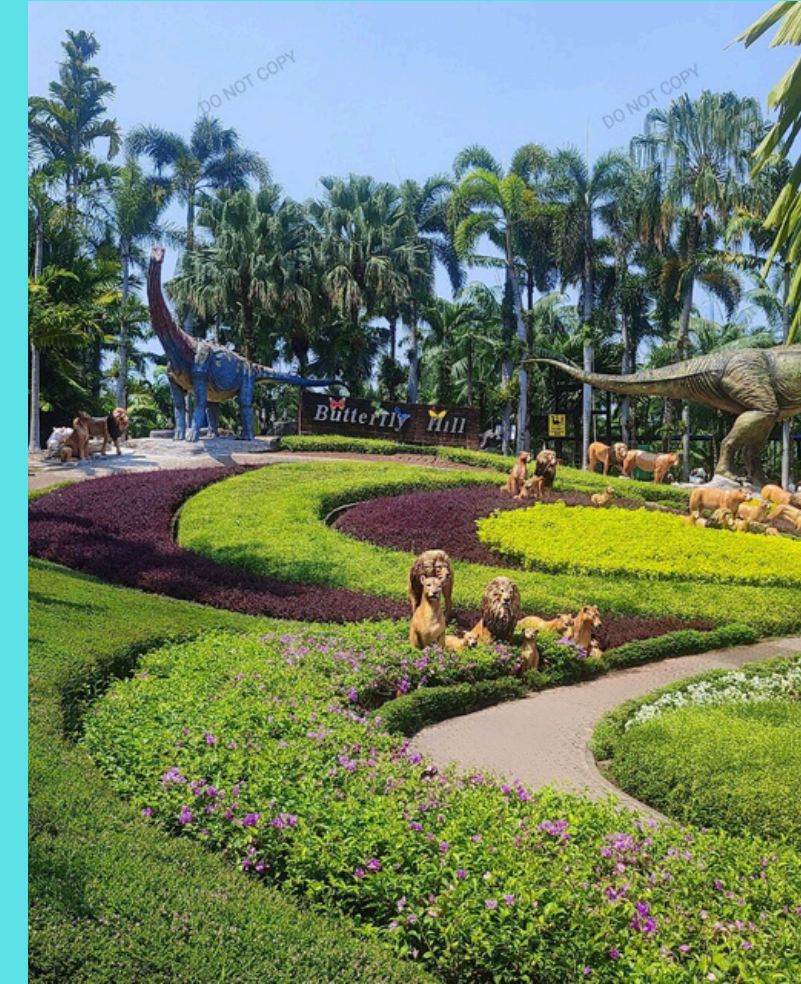

SANCTUARY OF TRUTH

The Sanctuary of Truth (Prasat Satchatham) is an architectural marvel and philosophical museum in Pattaya, Thailand, recognized as the largest wooden building in the country. Standing roughly 105 metres tall, it is a hybrid of a temple and a castle constructed entirely out of wood including the bolts without using a single metal nail.



NONG NOOCH TROPICAL GARDEN

Nong Nooch Tropical Garden is a massive 600 acre botanical paradise in Pattaya, Thailand featuring world class themed gardens, Dinosaur Valley and daily Thai cultural and elephant shows. Opened in 1980. It serves as a major conservation center for rare plants, offering visitors a blend of nature, culture and entertainment.



KOH LARN (CORAL ISLAND)

Koh Larn (Coral Island) is a scenic affordable and popular island getaway located only 7.5 km from Pattaya, Thailand. Renowned for its clear, blue waters and white sand beaches. It is easily reachable via a 15–45 minute speedboat or ferry ride from Bali Hai Pier. The island offers popular beaches like Tawaen, Samae, and Nual with activities including snorkeling, parasailing and jet skiing.



JOMTIEN BEACH & PATTAYA BEACH

Jomtien Beach and Pattaya Beach offer distinct experiences in Pattaya, Thailand. Pattaya Beach (central) is bustling, noisy and close to nightlife, ideal for thrill seekers and tourists desiring action. Jomtien 3–6km south offers a quieter cleaner 6km stretch popular with families long term expats and watersports enthusiasts (windsurfing, sailing).



WALKING STREET

Pattaya Walking Street is a world renowned 1 kilometer, pedestrian only entertainment strip in Thailand operating from 7 PM to 3 AM. It is the city's nightlife hub packed with neon lit go go bars, nightclubs, live music venues and seafood restaurants. The area is loud, chaotic and heavily centered on adult entertainment.

BIG BUDDHA TEMPLE (WAT PHRA YAI)

Wat Phra Yai (Big Buddha Temple) in Pattaya is a revered free entry landmark on Pratumnak Hill featuring an impressive 18-meter tall golden Buddha statue constructed in 1977. It offers panoramic city views intricate Naga lined staircases and a peaceful spiritual atmosphere that contrasts with Pattaya's nightlife making it a popular cultural attraction.



PATTAYA FLOATING MARKET

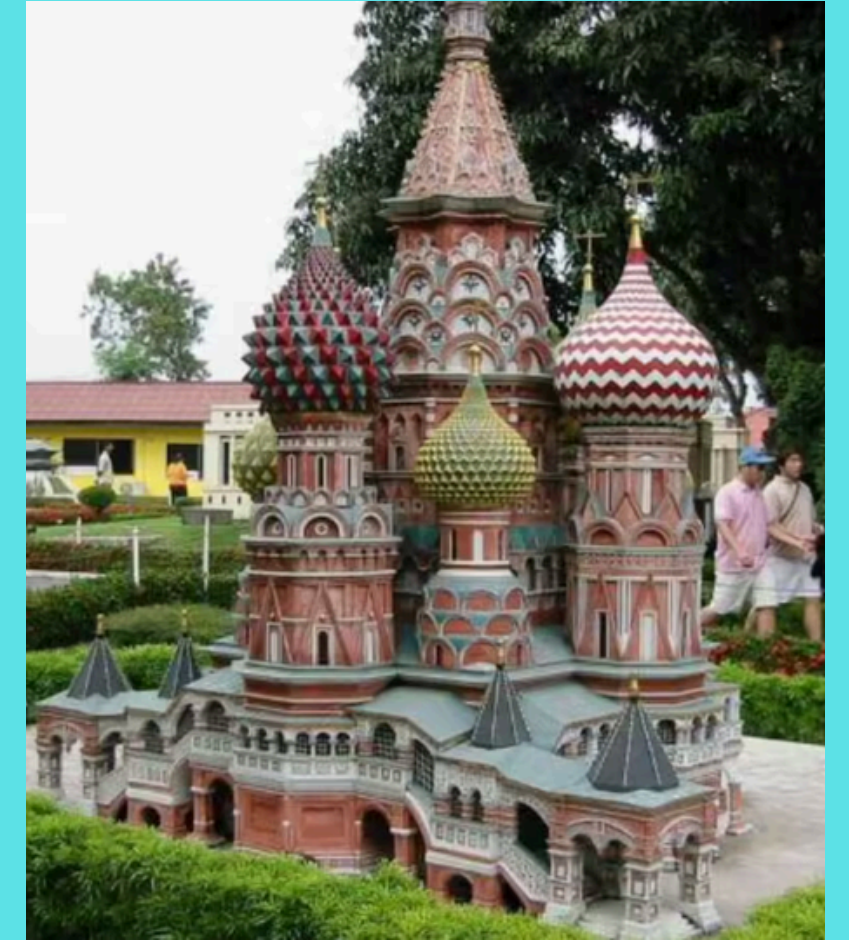
The Pattaya Floating Market operating since 2008 is a popular 100,000 sq.m. cultural attraction showcasing traditional Thai riverside living, local products and foods from four major regions. Located on Sukhumvit Road, it features boat rides, shops and cultural shows designed for a 2-3 hour visit.

ART IN PARADISE

Art in Paradise Pattaya is a premier interactive 3D illusion art museum recognized as the first of its kind in Thailand. Featuring over 100 hand painted, large-scale, 3D artworks visitors can step inside paintings and engage with exhibits creating unique, perspective driven photos. Located near Pattaya City Hall. it operates daily and offers 10 distinct themed zones.

MINI SIAM

Mini Siam in Pattaya is a popular miniature park showcasing over 100 1:25 scale replicas of world renowned landmarks. Founded in 1986 by Kasem Kasemkietsakul, it was designed as an educational attraction for those unable to travel globally allowing visitors to see the "world in a day".
